Egg Freezing for Social Reasons

A qualitative study on Reproductive Autonomy and Legal Regulation

What is the goal of the study?

To gain a deeper understanding of the consenting processes for egg freezing for social reasons – from both **service provider** and **service user** perspectives – and determine whether they are operating effectively with regard to users' reproductive autonomy.

Who can participate?

- Service Providers: healthcare professionals currently/previously working in a UK clinic offering egg freezing for social reasons
- Service Users: people who have undergone at least one cycle of egg freezing for social reasons in a UK clinic

The term social reasons is used here to refer to situations where service users freeze their eggs for any reason other than purely medical infertility.

What is involved in the study?

Research participants are being asked to take part in a **60-90 minute semi-structured virtual interview** (conducted via Microsoft Teams)
