Azerbaijan hands over Armenian soldiers in Swap for land mine maps

Azerbaijan handed over 15 captured Armenian soldiers in exchange for land mine maps, the two countries' foreign ministries said on July 3.

Azerbaijan and ethnic Armenian forces fought a six-week war that ended with a Moscow-brokered cease-fire in November which saw Baku regain control over parts of the disputed Nagorno-Karabakh region and seven adjacent districts.

In a statement, Azerbaijan's Foreign Ministry said Russia mediated a deal for Armenia to provide maps detailing the location of around 92,000 anti-tank and anti-personnel mines in the recaptured Fizuli and Zangilan regions. "As a humane step, the Azerbaijani side has extradited to Armenia 15 people of Armenian origin," it said.

"As a goodwill gesture, the Armenian side provided Azerbaijan with maps of minefields in the Fizuli and Zangilan regions," the Armenian government said.

Nagorno-Karabakh and surrounding districts are among the most heavily mined areas of the former Soviet Union. Since the November cease-fire, seven Azerbaijani troops and 18 civilians have died and more than 100 have been wounded by land mines in the area.

Azerbaijan's government hopes obtaining mine maps will help save lives and accelerate construction so that people displaced from villages and towns during a bloody conflict in the early 1990s can return to their lands.

In June, Azerbaijan and Armenian struck a similar deal that traded 15 prisoners for mine maps of the Agdam district.

BP: Azerbaijan produced 25.8bcm natural gas in 2020

Azerbaijan's natural gas production amounted to 25.8 billion cubic meters in 2020, which is a growth by 6 percent compared to 2019, BP said in its annual statistical review of the world's energy report.

The country's proven natural gas reserves amounted to 2.5 trillion cubic meters at the end of 2020, BP said.

According to the report, by the end of 2020, proven global gas reserves amounted to 188.1 trillion cubic meters, and Azerbaijan's share in it was 1.3 percent.

- The natural gas consumption in the country amounted to 11.9 billion cubic meters in 2020 while total exports of natural gas from Azerbaijan by pipelines were reported at 13.6 billion cubic meters, according to the report.
- Furthermore, BP reported Azerbaijan's proved oil reserves to stay unchanged from the end of 2019 as well, and amount to 7 billion barrels at the end of 2020. The country's proven oil reserves amounted to 1.2 billion barrels at the end of 2000.
- By the end of 2020, proven world's oil reserves hit 244.4 billion barrels, with Azerbaijan accounting for 0.4 percent.
- Meanwhile, Azerbaijan's crude oil and condensate production amounted to 702,000 barrels per day. Oil consumption in the country amounted to 92,000 barrels per day in 2020.
- It should be noted that the countries with the largest oil reserves in the world remain Venezuela with 303.8 billion barrels, Saudi Arabia with 297.5 billion barrels and Canada with 168.1 billion barrels.

Azerbaijan, Turkey, Pakistan sign Baku Declaration

The parliaments of Azerbaijan, Turkey and Pakistan have signed the Baku Declaration on cooperation. The document was signed following the trilateral meeting held by speakers of the three countries' parliaments on July 27.

The Chairman of the Turkish Parliament Mustafa Shentop said that the Baku Declaration signed between Azerbaijan, Turkey and Pakistan, will contribute to ensure the regional security. Addressing the trilateral meeting with his Azerbaijani and Pakistani counterparts in Baku, Sentop said that "the Baku Declaration, which will be signed following the meeting, will contribute to ensuring security in the region. This document will play an important role in terms of institutionalizing trilateral relations." "I think that holding of meetings in this format will contribute to the further development of relations among three fraternal countries," he added. The Chairman stressed the importance of friendship, and brotherhood among Turkey, Pakistan and Azerbaijan, by stating that the first meeting of the speakers of the parliaments of Azerbaijan, Pakistan and Turkey will be held in Baku on the initiative of Islamabad. In his words, the international platform and mechanism would strengthen relations among three countries in the future. Shentop reminded that during the second Karabakh war, both Turkey and Pakistan politically and morally supported Azerbaijan.

Addressing the meeting, Speaker of the Azerbaijani Parliament Sahiba Gafarova said that a trilateral platform of cooperation between the three countries' parliaments is being created. Gafarova said that meetings will be held in this format, and the transformation of this format into an even more fruitful platform over time will strengthen ties between the three countries.

In turn, Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan Asad Qaiser highly appreciated the establishment of a trilateral format of cooperation between the parliaments of Azerbaijan, Pakistan and Turkey. "We must expand our cooperation in the cultural, economic, educational, and other fields," the speaker said. Qaiser stated that within this platform, regular meetings will be held to discuss key issues. Furthermore, the speaker expressed Pakistan's satisfaction with Azerbaijan's victory during the 44-day Karabakh war. "This victory became possible thanks to the efforts of President of Azerbaijan Ilham Alivey, the unity of the Azerbaijani people," the chairman added.

Earlier President Ilham Aliyev received the delegations headed by Speaker of Pakistan's National Assembly, Asad Qaise and by Chairman of the Grand National Assembly of Turkey Mustafa Sentop.

Azerbaijani firefighters prevent spread of fires in Turkey's Marmaris region 02.08.2021

Azerbaijani firefighters have prevented the spread of fires in some parts of Turkey's Marmaris region. The Azerbaijan Ministry of Emergency Situations continues to carry out work in this direction.

The Ministry of Emergency Situations has sent the groups of firefighters to Turkey in accordance with the instructions of the President Ilham Aliyev to extinguish forest fires and prevent their further spread.

The first group consisted of 100 firefighters who arrived in Turkey's Mugla province. Another team of firefighters and rescuers was sent to the fraternal country on July 31 night.

The second group includes 220 firefighters and rescuers, 53 firefighting and special rescue equipment, 1 helicopter, 1 ambulance.

Meanwhile, the Azerbaijan Ministry of Emergency Situations has sent a delegation of senior officials.

The delegation headed by Deputy Minister of Emergency Situations Lieutenant General Etibar Mirzayev left for Turkey on the morning of August 2.

Baku urges Russia peacekeepers to end Armenian troops' deployment in Azerbaijan

Baku has urged Russian peacekeepers, which have been temporarily stationed on Azerbaijani territories under the November 10, 2020, trilateral peace deal, to put an end to the Armenian troops' deployment on the formerly Armenian-occupied Azerbaijani territories currently under their control.

In an official statement published on its website on August 11, the Azerbaijani Defence Ministry said: "In accordance with the provisions of the tripartite statement, the Russian Federation's peacekeeping forces must put an end to the deployment of the Armenian armed forces on the Azerbaijani territories where they are temporarily stationed". The ministry underlined that under the trilateral deal signed by the Azerbaijani, Russian and Armenian leaders in 2020, the remnants of the Armenian armed forces have not been fully removed from the Azerbaijani territories. The statement stressed that Armenia has recently been flagrantly violating the trilateral deal by moving its armed forces to Azerbaijan, where Russian peacekeepers are temporarily stationed, and setting up new Armenian posts near Mukhtarkand and Shushakand, as well as in the eastern part of Kalbajar and Lachin regions.

The presence of any Armenian serviceman on Azerbaijan's internationally-recognized territories is believed to be in violation of the November 10 peace deal signed by Baku, Moscow and Yerevan that ended the 44-day war between Armenia and Azerbaijan in 2020.

About 2,000 Russian peacekeepers have been deployed for five years in Karabakh under the Moscow-brokered trilateral cease-fire deal. The signed agreement obliged Armenia to withdraw all its troops from the Azerbaijani lands that it had occupied since the early 1990s.

The deal also stipulated the return of Azerbaijan's Kalbajar, Aghdam and Lachin regions. Before the signing of the peace deal, Azerbaijan liberated 300 villages, settlements, city centres, and historic Shusha city that had been under Armenian occupation for about 30 years.

Aliyev criticizes Russia's arms supplies to Armenia

In an interview with the Turkish television channel CNN Türk, Azerbaijani leader Ilham Aliyev was critical of Russia's alleged plan to intensively supply Armenia with weapons. Aliyev openly warned Russia against supplying arms to Armenia, recalling that many Russian weapons are already on display in the "trophy park" in downtown Baku. These words came several days after the meeting between Russian Defence Minister Sergei Shoigu and his counterpart from Armenia Arshak Karapetyan.

"We expect Russia to implement all the provisions of the trilateral declaration [of November 9, 2020]. Because this trilateral declaration was signed by the leaders of Azerbaijan, Russia and Armenia and most of it has already been implemented. But there are some issues that are still open.... Russia, as a neighbour of Azerbaijan and a close ally of Armenia, certainly plays a special role in this region. This is only natural. We hope that Russia will continue to spare no effort to ensure security in the region and take measures to ensure lasting peace. At the same time, we assume that Russia will not arm Armenia. We have brought this issue to the attention of Russian officials. We are concerned about it. The war is over. The people of Armenia have come to terms with this situation. The Armenian government has also resigned itself to its own defeat, as the recent parliamentary elections in Armenia showed.

Thus, the population has already signalled its preference for a defeated party. Such a thing has never happened in history, that a defeated party is supported by the people..."

"The area in Khankandi (Stepanakert), which is under the control of the Russian peacekeeping mission, is now a safe area. At the same time, the situation on our border with Armenia is sometimes worrying, but on the whole it is stable. So, of course, we want Russia to take into account our concerns on this issue. Because no matter how many weapons are delivered, the balance of power will not change. Over the past 30 years, Russia has provided Armenia with billions of dollars worth of weapons for free - some of which are now on display in our trophy park...," Aliyev said.

Azerbaijani-Russian relations have been marked by growing tensions in recent weeks. Russia's Defence Ministry, for example, said on Aug. 12 that Azerbaijan had violated the ceasefire in Nagorno-Karabakh by using combat drones to attack Armenian positions. For its part, Azerbaijan insists that all Armenian military units must be withdrawn from the part of Nagorno-Karabakh where Russia's peacekeepers are stationed, which has not yet happened. In doing so, Baku refers to the 4th point of the November 9 Trilateral Declaration, which states that Armenian troops must be withdrawn from the region simultaneously with the deployment of the Russian peacekeeping contingent.

Yerevan accuses Azerbaijan of blocking major road connecting Two Parts of Armenian Region

Armenia's National Security Service (NSS) says that dozens of Azerbaijani soldiers have blocked a road between two parts of Armenia's southern region of Syunik after an alleged stabbing incident.

The NSS said that the Karmrakar-Shurnukh section of the Goris-Kapan highway was closed at about 11 p.m. on August 25, with vehicles in the area being removed.

It added that negotiations with the Azerbaijani side on the reopening of the road, which were reportedly conducted by Russian border guards deployed in the area as part of a peace accord, continued on August 26.

Azerbaijan did not immediately comment on the accusation, but earlier in the day its Defence Ministry claimed that two Armenian soldiers attempted to stab an Azerbaijani border guard in the area.

Armenia's Defence Ministry denied there was any incident, calling the statement a "sheer lie" and "more Azerbaijani disinformation."

A 21-kilometer stretch of the road linking two Armenian towns, Goris and Kapan, was built in the Soviet times partly through the territory of Azerbaijan due to peculiarities of the local terrain.

- It created no problems during Soviet times when borders between Soviet republics were administrative.
- After the disintegration of the Soviet Union and a 1992-1994 war in the breakaway region of Nagorno-Karabakh, the territory came under the full control of ethnic Armenians who declared their independence from Baku in the former autonomous region and expanded into some territories outside of Nagorno-Karabakh proper.
- Azerbaijani forces regained control of the territory as a result of last year's war with Armenia.
- Under a Russian-brokered peace accord signed between Yerevan and Baku to end the conflict, the 21-kilometer section of the road will continue to be used by Armenians under the supervision of Russian border guards until Armenia can build an alternative road.
- Azerbaijani forces regained control of the territory as a result of last year's war with Armenia that ended with a Russian-brokered cease-fire agreement signed between Yerevan and Baku to end the conflict.
- Eventually, an arrangement was made between Armenia and Russia that the 21-kilometer section of the road will continue to be used by Armenians under the control of Russian border-guards until Armenia can build another alternative road for all types of transportation that will connect two parts of the Syunik region, which is also vital for Armenia's connection with Iran.

Turkey, Azerbaijan, Pakistan launches joint military drills in Baku

- Turkish, Azerbaijani and Pakistani militaries launched their first-ever joint exercises "Three Brothers 2021" in Baku on Sunday.
- Speaking at the ceremony, Lt. Gen. Hikmat Mirzayev, Azerbaijan's special forces commander, said he was pleased to see the representatives of Turkish and Pakistani special forces in his country. "Azerbaijan, Turkey and Pakistan have entered the history of humanity as close friends and brothers. At the heart of these relations are the close ties between our peoples. Evidence of this can be seen in the solidarity and support of Turkey and Pakistan to Azerbaijan from the first day of the 44-day counteroffensive operations launched by Azerbaijan against the Armenian armed forces on Sept. 27, 2020," Azerbaijan's Defence Ministry quoted him as saying.
- He was referring to the Nagorno-Karabakh war, which began last September and ended six weeks later following a Russia-brokered truce in November.
- "Today, cooperation between our countries in all areas is at the highest level. Important measures are being taken to further strengthen and develop our relations to ensure the region's and peoples' security," Mirzayev said.

He hoped that the exercises, which will be held until Sept. 20, will provide an extensive exchange of experience and views between servicemen of the three countries and will "greatly contribute" to further improvement of the professional training.

The heads of Turkish and Pakistani delegations, Lt. Col. Kursat Konuk and Lt. Col. Aamir Shahzad, said the existing bond of friendship between the nations and armies "would stand the test of time" in a rapidly changing global environment.

Turkey and Azerbaijan held joint live-fire drills in Baku earlier this year.

Azerbaijan levies duties on vehicles going through Armenia's Goris-Kapan road

Armenian authorities have complained about Azerbaijani border guards searching and charging transport duties on Iranian cars passing through sections of Armenia's Goris-Kapan road that are controlled by Azerbaijan. Azerbaijani authorities have said that the checks and fees are part of established protocol.

The Goris-Kapan road is the primary traffic artery in southern Armenia. The Soviet-era road skirts and occasionally crosses the internationally recognised border between Armenia and Azerbaijan. Since the end of the Second Nagorno-Karabakh War, a roughly 20-kilometre section of the road has been under Azerbaijani control.

According to Civilnet, an independent media outlet based in Yerevan, Iranian drivers were told that they had to pay \$130 to be allowed to drive through the road. Additionally, Azerbaijani troops reportedly erected banners on both sides of the road that read: 'You are entering the territory of Azerbaijan'.

Azerbaijan's State Customs Committee stated on Monday that the Iranian cars passing through the Goris-Kapan highway are subject to a 'state duty for the issuance of a permit regulating international road transport in the territory of the Republic of Azerbaijan'.

Armenia's National Security Service has since announced that they are currently in discussion with Russian border officials, who are stationed on that same stretch of road, to address the issue.

In recent months, Azerbaijani authorities have expressed consternation with Iranian cargo vehicles entering the sections of Nagorno-Karabakh overseen by Russian peacekeepers. In August, Azerbaijan sent an official 'diplomatic note' to Iran over the issue.

Armenia, Azerbaijan mark one-year anniversary of war

A year after the outbreak of war between Azerbaijan and Armenia, the two countries commemorated those who were killed in the fighting.

- On September 27, 2020, Azerbaijan launched an offensive aimed at retaking the territories it had lost in the first war with Armenia in the 1990s. In the 44 days of fighting that followed, an estimated 7,000 soldiers and civilians were killed and tens of thousands wounded. Azerbaijan managed to take back most of its lost territory, forcing thousands of ethnic Armenians to flee their homes. Meanwhile, the hundreds of thousands of Azerbaijanis who were themselves forced to flee in the first war have not yet been able to return to their former homes, though the Azerbaijani government has been quickly reconstructing some infrastructure in its retaken territories.
- On the evening of September 26, thousands marched to Yerevan's Yerablur military cemetery, carrying torches in commemoration of those who were killed. Another torchlight march was held the same evening in Stepanakert, the de facto capital of Nagorno-Karabakh.
- The Yerevan march was led by former president Robert Kocharyan and members of other opposition parties. "Today is a memorial march. With this march, we show that we do not accept defeat, we will stand up and continue the work of our heroes," said Ishkhan Saghatelyan, the deputy speaker of parliament for the Kocharyan-led Armenia Alliance.
- In a sign of the deep political grievances that continue to divide the country, even events like independence day celebrations or memorials to fallen soldiers cannot unite Armenians: Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan paid a separate visit to Yerablur the following morning.
- In both Armenia and Karabakh, a minute of silence was observed at 11 a.m.
- Pashinyan also telephoned the de facto leader of Nagorno-Karabakh, Arayik Harutyunyan; Pashinyan's office said the two men discussed ongoing efforts to "ensure the return of Armenian prisoners of war held in Azerbaijan to the homeland, the solution of security issues, as well as the ensuring normal life in Artsakh [an alternate Armenian name for Karabakh], the improvement of infrastructure and the construction of housing."
- On the morning of the anniversary, the Investigative Committee of Armenia announced an updated official number of deaths during the war: 3,781, including both soldiers and civilians. As of now, the whereabouts of 231 service members and 22 civilians are unknown.
- In Azerbaijan, a series of events marking the date took place that mixed the commemorative with the triumphal. President Ilham Aliyev decreed that the anniversary would be marked annually as Memorial Day, devoted to the soldiers killed during the war. Azerbaijan has said that 2,907 of its soldiers were killed.
- Aliyev said that the foundation for a new war memorial and Museum of Victory would be laid that day.
- Aliyev and his wife, First Vice President Mehriban Aliyeva, attended a march of 3,000 soldiers in Baku to the site of the war memorial and museum.
- Azerbaijan also observed a minute of silence, at 12 o'clock.
- In Shusha, the historic Karabakh city that was the single biggest prize of the war, a small military parade was held.

President: Azerbaijan ready for dialogue with Armenia

President Ilham Aliyev has said that Azerbaijan is ready for a dialogue with Armenia to go towards peace.

He made the remarks in an interview with the French France 24 TV channel on September 28.

"Azerbaijan never, even during the war, during the occupation, never objected any kind of high-level contacts. On the contrary, we think that these communications may answer many questions which both sides may have, and also to be a starting point for the new development of the region," he said.

The president said that his meeting with Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan is possible if the OSCE Minsk Group co-chairs come up with a relevant initiative.

Aliyev noted the conflict between the two countries is resolved and there should be no return to the past. "There should be no signs of revanchism in Armenia. We need to talk about the future, we need to talk about peace, and how to make our region more stable and safe," he underlined.

"The meeting of the foreign ministers of both countries [in New York on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly's 76th session] is a good indicator of these endeavors. I hope that it will not be the only meeting, but it will be the beginning of a new process, the process of normalization of relations between Azerbaijan and Armenia and the process which will give and can give a new dimension to broad cooperation in the region of Southern Caucasus," Aliyev stated.

The president ruled out any territorial claims by Azerbaijan to Armenia.

Aliyev stated that like every other nation, Azerbaijan's young generation should know national and ancient history, and which territories they were living on and how to go back.

Aliyev noted that during the war France was not behaving like an honest broker, as it took Armenia's side, openly accusing Azerbaijan, demonstrating a one-sided approach in its statements and actions. "If France was not a co-chair of the Minsk Group, of course, any kind of relations between any kind of countries is up to them. And we know about the historical ties between France and Armenia, we know about the very active Armenian community in France, which to a certain degree may influence decision-makers," the president added. Aliyev also expressed the hope that as an honest broker, as a co-chair of the Minsk group France will be committed to this responsibility.

Speaking about prisoners of war, the president underlined that all those taken as prisoners during the 44-day war in 2020 have been returned to Armenia. He noted that those who are currently held in Azerbaijan, according to all international conventions cannot be considered as prisoners of war, as they have been detained after the war stopped. Aliyev underlined that many of them had already been returned to Armenia as a sign of goodwill.

Azerbaijan-Iran relations strained over truck driver arrests

Azerbaijan's relations with Iran have been in flux since the end of last year's war with Armenia. The most recent rocky period started when Azerbaijan began charging fees to Iranian trucks on a road through southern Armenia that passes through slices of Azerbaijani territory in some places.

At first, Iran remained silent even after Azerbaijani police and customs confirmed the practice. Armenian media reported that some of the trucks targeted had been "transporting cement to Yerevan and Stepanakert," the de facto capital of Nagorno-Karabakh. The territory is internationally recognized as Azerbaijani but had been controlled by Armenian forces since the first war between the two sides in the 1990s.

The drivers had been detained because they "entered Azerbaijan illegally from Armenia and relevant measures will be taken," spokesperson of the Ministry of Interior Affairs of Azerbaijan Ehsan Zahidov confirmed the following day. Azerbaijan has long held that entry into Karabakh via Armenia amounts to an illegal border crossing.

Iran's foreign ministry responded by demanding the release of the drivers and to meet with Azerbaijani officials to resolve the issue.

A series of meetings have taken place since then but the fate of the drivers is still unknown.

Tension has been exacerbated by naval military exercises conducted jointly by Turkey and Azerbaijan in the Caspian Sea. Iran's foreign ministry said that the drills violated an international convention banning foreign military forces from the sea. (Azerbaijani analysts retorted that Iran is the only Caspian littoral country not to have ratified the convention.) Iran then held its own military drills close to its border with Azerbaijan.

Meanwhile, in Iran a variety of officials have been heaping abuse on Azerbaijan. In Baku, however, analysts say the government appears to be motivated by long-running irritation at Iranian trucks supplying Nagorno-Karabakh.


Following Azerbaijan's gaining control of some stretches of the road, which connects the key southern Armenian cities of Goris and Kapan and which is Armenia's only highway to Iran. Baku has been able to act on those Iranian deliveries.

The war also resulted in Azerbaijan regaining territory very close to the Lachin corridor, the road that connects Armenia to Nagorno-Karabakh. That has allowed Azerbaijan to surveil the road for what it sees as illegal border crossings. President Aliyev, in a September 27 interview with Turkish media, said that in the period between August 11 and September 11 Baku had counted 60 Iranian trucks using the road. Some of them, he said, appeared to be trying to hide their identity by using Armenian license plates.

He also said Iranian officials had repeatedly refused to act. "The first time [the Azerbaijani side issued] a verbal warning, the second, an official note, and the third, posts - customs,

border, police. In this way we have begun to control the road through Azerbaijani territory," Aliyev said. As a result, he said, the number of Iranian trucks passing through Lachin has "dropped to zero."

As for the most recent tensions between the two countries, political analyst Eldar Mamedov suggests they will not fundamentally change the relationship.

Secretary of Russia's Security Council Nikolai Patrushev visiting Minsk

Secretary of the Russia's Security Council Nikolai Patrushev was in Minsk on an official visit.

The agenda of the visit included meeting with Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko. During the meeting Lukashenko and Patrushev discussed not only cooperation in security but also in the defense sector and military industry. Nikolai Patrushev noted that he is happy to be in Minsk and to see positive changes. "Every time I come to Belarus I am happy to see what is going on here," he said.

Bilateral consultations of Belarus and Russia Security Councils were hosted the same day by Secretary of the Russian Security Council Nikolai Patrushev and State Secretary of the Belarusian Security Council Aleksandr Volfovich and brought together representatives of ministries and agencies of the two countries. The consultations focused on the hybrid influences on Russia and Belarus, response to the attempts to interfere with the internal affairs of sovereign states. There was an exchange of views on pressing issues of international security, including the Open Skies Treaty, the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention, and biological security. The parties outlined the plans regarding further cooperation between the Security Councils, defense ministries, special services and law enforcement agencies of Russia and Belarus.

Foreigners encouraged to get vaccine shots in Belarus

Citizens of 73 countries allowed to come without visas and stay in Belarus for up to five days in order to get COVID-19 vaccine shots (during 15 July 2021 to 31 December 2022). The established procedure for the vaccination of foreigners (including collection and processing of applications in an information system, the actual vaccination, and the issuance of vaccination certificates) will be applied to all the foreign citizens, including those, who can enter Belarus due to other reasons.

Belarusian government discusses counteraction to Western sanctions

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko called to work out measures to mitigate sanctions' negative impact on Belarus, he also compared restrictive measures to blackmailing. "There should not be any economic slowdown or downturn. This is out of the question. A war is going on," Aleksandr Lukashenko said.

Next round of sanctions was introduced on June 22, 2021.

According to Aleksandr Lukashenko, "we don't want the Belarusian people to be hurt. It is the key thing for us. It is the government's job to come up with effective measures to compensate for the losses and preserve jobs." Possible counter-measures are to include import substitution, domestic demand stimulation, restriction in regard to certain foreign companies (at example of Skoda, Nivea, and so on), suspension of transit from certain countries via Belarus.

"The government and the National Bank should take a close look at the Western companies doing business in Belarus. Those, who show a responsible attitude and understand us, are free to cooperate with us. But if someone fails to understand us and has started a fight against the Belarusian state, you know how they should be dealt with," Aleksandr Lukashenko said.

New head of Belarus President Property Management Directorate appointed

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko has appointed Valery Ivanov Head of the Belarus President Property Management Directorate. Valery Ivanov has been in charge of the Belarusian National Union of Consumer Societies (Belkoopsoyuz).

Aleksandr Lukashenko said: "I've decided to put you in charge of the president property directorate. It is one of the top 11 government jobs. In addition to running the president property directorate you will have to take care of matters as a top government official. It means there are no matters in Belarus that you should not be concerned with. They are all yours regardless of wherever you go and whatever you do."

BelTA reported earlier that on 15 June Aleksandr Lukashenko signed the decree to relieve Viktor Sheiman of his post as the head of the Belarus President Property Management Directorate.

Lukashenko and Putin held talks in St. Petersburg

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin held talks in the Konstantinovsky Palace in St. Petersburg on 13 July. The heads of state discussed cooperation prospects in various fields and the international agenda.

Vladimir Putin noted that in 2020, the trade between the countries increased by 17%. In April - May of this year, the trade was on the rise too. It surged by more than 37%. "This is a good indicator," the Russian head of state emphasized, stressing that "Belarus is a reliable, stable partner". In St. Petersburg the presidents are set to decide how to move forward, the Russian head of state said.

Aleksandr Lukashenko noted the need to pay close attention to the security of Belarus and Russia, stressed the importance of economic cooperation. He addressed in details internal situation in Belarus and mentioned that the Belarusian government had started a vigorous campaign to crack down on various not-for-profit organizations, non-governmental organizations, and so-called Western mass media.

Belarus legislation on protection of sovereignty and constitutional system amended 15.07.2021

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko has signed the law on amending the laws on protecting the sovereignty and the constitutional system.

The law amends the law on the state of emergency. In line with the Constitution and this law in addition to natural calamities and catastrophes the reasons for declaring the state of emergency include riots accompanied by violence or the threat of violence from a group of individuals and organizations, which endangers lives and health of people, the territorial integrity and the existence of the state. There was no clear definition of rioting in the past. It led to the controversial understanding of reasons for declaring a state of emergency particularly if riots do not look like mass-scale ones. For these reasons the law describes riots as attempts to forcibly change the constitutional system, capture or assume authority, as an armed insurrection, mass riots, interethnic and interreligious conflicts, which are accompanied by violent actions that pose an immediate threat to the lives and safety of citizens.

The new law also clarifies the list of possible extraordinary measures and temporary restrictions, which can be introduced when the state of emergency is declared. This norm was worked out taking into account the experience of response to riots in 2020. Thus, the possible extraordinary measures and temporary restrictions now include the suspension of publication and distribution of mass media products (including foreign ones), the introduction of a special procedure for reporter accreditation, the restriction on access to Internet resources and online media. The authority of the commandant of the territory where the state of emergency is introduced is clarified and expanded by the law.

The list of law enforcement, security, and defense bodies, which are employed to enforce the state of emergency, has been expanded to include paramilitary organizations. It will allow most effectively and completely legally deploy forces and assets of the Emergencies Ministry, the Investigative Committee, the State Forensic Examination Committee, and the Financial Investigations Department. The tasks such bodies may be assigned now include prevention and suppression of riots, protection of public order and public security.

Apart from that, the Belarusian army can now be used to accomplish tasks as part of the state response system in accordance with the law on the Armed Forces of the Republic of Belarus. Taking into account the accumulated practical experience the law specifies the army's tasks as part of this system: fight against terrorism, protection of public security, suppression of mass riots, protection of guarded persons, secure facilities and installations.

Apart from that, provisions of Belarus president ordinance No. 2 of 9 May 2021 on protecting the sovereignty and the constitutional system have been implemented into the law on the state of emergency and the law on the state of martial law.

Governmental Meeting to discuss Belarus' current foreign policy priorities

Legislation on citizenship updated in Belarus

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko signed Decree No. 302 to amend legislation on citizenship. The decree introduces a new institution – the restoration of citizenship, expands foreigners and children for obtaining citizenship under a simplified procedure.

The document specifies the procedure of submitting materials to the president on the loss of Belarusian citizenship by naturalized persons due to the participation in extremist activities or inflicting serious damage to the interests of Belarus. The decree also regulates the process of terminating proceedings concerning the application for citizenship in cases envisaged in the law.

Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko, State Secretary of the Security Council Aleksandr Volfovich, Minister of Foreign Affairs Vladimir Makei and Chief of the General Staff of the Armed Forces - First Deputy Defence Minister Viktor Gulevich took part in an extraordinary session of the Collective Security Council of the Collective Security Treaty Organization (CSTO) on the situation in Afghanistan. The event was summoned at the initiative of Russia and was held in the format of a video conference. Leaders of the CSTO member states were joined by Uzbekistan President Shavkat Mirziyoyev.

The CSTO has been carefully monitoring the development of the situation on the Tajik-Afghan border. The main goal of the organization in the current circumstances is to ensure the security of the CSTO member states. The priority in the organization's activities continues to be given to political and diplomatic means.

Telephone conversation with Russian President Vladimir Putin

The two heads of state discussed the Union State programs; the work on them is nearing completion. Lukashenko and Putin also touched upon the upcoming Belarus-Russia strategic army exercise Zapad 2021. The presidents discussed in detail the situation on Belarus' borders with NATO. They also talked about cooperation in personnel training for the military and special services, as well as interaction in mass media.

Presidents also scheduled high-level contacts for the near future.

Aleksandr Lukashenko met with Chairman of Kazakhstan's National Security Committee Karim Massimov to discuss the prospects for the development of cooperation between the special services of the two countries.

Speaking about the cooperation of the special services of Belarus and Kazakhstan, Aleksandr Lukashenko noted that they have established productive cooperation. "The agreements that you will reach with your Belarusian counterpart [KGB head] will be executed faithfully. We will work together where it is necessary and beneficial for us and Kazakhstan," the head of state said. "It would be great if our special services establish an additional channel of communication through which we will discuss and make decisions on sensitive issues."

Belarus and Kazakhstan have traditionally friendly and close relations in all avenues. Aleksandr Lukashenko noted that at the CSTO summit in Dushanbe he intends to meet with Kazakhstan President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev and discuss the development of cooperation between the countries.

"I think we have a lot to discuss, as we are friendly countries. We have common goals and objectives. We must help each other," Karim Massimov said.

Bill to suspend Belarus-EU readmission agreement in parliament soon

Aleksandr Lukashenko has decided in favor of bringing a bill on suspending the agreement between the Republic of Belarus and the European Union on the readmission of individuals, who stay without permission, into the House of Representatives of the National Assembly. The document was prepared by the government in response to unfriendly actions of the European Union and its member states towards Belarus, the press service of the Belarus President told

The agreement stipulates the procedure for transferring, accepting, and returning the individuals, who violate terms of entry, stay, and residence. Belarus' corresponding obligations will be put on hold soon.

Lukashenko-Putin talks held in Moscow

Belarusian President Aleksandr Lukashenko and Russian President Vladimir Putin held talks in the Kremlin on 9 September.

- Lukashenko and Putin have reconciled all the 28 Union State programs. These programs will be discussed by the governments and later will be forwarded for consideration of the Supreme State Council of the Union State of Belarus and Russia, which session is supposed to take place by the end of the year.
- There are 28 of Union State programs in total. These documents include the agreements on economic integration, which embraces common approaches to macroeconomic policies, monetary aspects, industrial and agrarian policies, customs administration, tax legislation, consumer protection, competition and trade. The programs also deal with the energy industry, including the development of the common markets, nuclear energy. There is also a program devoted to common approaches in the work in the transport market. The Union State programs suggest unifying social and labor laws, ensuring equality of rights of citizens of Belarus and Russia, tourism sector.
- The Union State programs also provide for a solution to the issue of energy supplies to Belarus. As for the near future, according to Vladimir Putin, mutually acceptable approaches to the gas issue have been developed following lengthy discussions. "The price Belarus will pay for Russian natural gas in 2022 will remain at this year's level. A document will be signed by 1 December 2023 on creating the common natural gas market within the framework of the Union State of Belarus and Russia," said the Russian president. Now Belarus pays \$128.5 per 1,000 cubic meters of Russian gas. The countries are also expected to sign an agreement on the unification of oil and oil products markets, and an agreement on a unified electricity market.
- According to Putin's statement, these programs are designed to unify the legislation of Belarus and Russia in various branches of economy. They are designed to level the playing field for Belarusian and Russian commercial entities, build common financial and energy markets, build transport space, work out and realize a common industrial and agricultural policy.
- Russian President also stated that matters concerning deeper political integration of Belarus and Russia within the framework of the Union State of Belarus and Russia were not discussed during the meeting. "We believe we should primarily focus on economy," he added. Vladimir Putin is convinced that additional regulation may be naturally required later on, including possibly at the level of formation of a union parliament. "I cannot rule out the possibility that a union parliament may be established but we have to grow up for that to happen. We didn't discuss it and such items were not on the agenda".
- Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko said he fully supports his Russian colleague in matters concerning deeper political integration in the Union State of Belarus and Russia.
- Migration situation on the borders of Belarus was also tackled. Vladimir Putin stated that some Western colleagues of him and European leaders had invited him to work together to resolve problems with migrants at the Belarusian border and had wanted him to somehow influence the situation. "The answer is simple: it does not concern us. It is not our border," he noted. He stressed that the migration crisis had emerged at the Belarusian border with other sovereign countries, this is why these countries should find solutions to problems on

their own. "If they want to truly resolve the problem, they should contact Belarusian authorities at any level and resolve the problem together with the neighboring country," the Russian leader said.

After the meeting of the two presidents, it became known that Russia was lifting all COVID-19 restrictions on passenger flights with Belarus.

On September 15 Belarusian President Aleksandr Lukashenko has met with Tajikistan President Emomali Rahmon during his working trip to Dushanbe.

The meeting of the two heads of state took place shortly after Aleksandr Lukashenko's arrival in Dushanbe. The two leaders discussed bilateral cooperation, the military and political situation in the region and the forthcoming summits of the CSTO and the SCO in the capital of Tajikistan.

Aleksandr Lukashenko also held a meeting with Tajikistan Prime Minister Kokhir Rasulzoda.

- On 16 September Aleksandr Lukashenko took part in the session of the Collective Security Council of the Collective Security Treaty Organization (CSTO) in Dushanbe.
- The agenda of the talks features only one topic, but the heads of state need to discuss a wide range of issues related to international and regional security and to take stock of the CSTO activities in the inter-session period. One of the most important issues will be the situation in Afghanistan. "The toughening competition between the West and China is contributing to the demolition of the system of international relations. To increase its influence in Asia, the European Union has put forward the initiative "A Globally Connected Europe", a rival to China's Belt and Road Initiative," Lukashenko said, later adding that "The worsening situation at the western borders of the CSTO is a dangerous trend"
- The Belarusian leader urged to maintain positive dynamics in expanding cooperation between the CSTO and international organizations.
- According to the President, migration issues require more attention. The head of state believes that the CSTO should take unified approaches to responding to risks and challenges in this area. He emphasized special importance of mutual support of allies in the international arena, including the UN and the OSCE. Aleksandr Lukashenko also stated that the consequences of COVID-19 underscore the necessity to develop cooperation within the CSTO in biological security.
- On September 16 Lukashenko also held number of bilateral talks.
- As he met with Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan in Dushanbe on 16 September, he stated that Belarus is extremely interested in developing cooperation with Pakistan. The parties agreed to intensify work on the preparation for a meeting of the intergovernmental commission. Belarusian Minister of Foreign Affairs Vladimir Makei is expected to visit Pakistan in 2021.
- After meeting with Iran President Ebrahim Raisi, Aleksandr Lukashenko made the statement that Iran and Belarus have always found ways towards success regardless of the international situation. During the meeting Aleksandr Lukashenko and Ebrahim Raisi paid close attention to foreign sanctions. During the meeting it was noted that the level of bilateral relations clearly does not match the potential. The ministers of foreign affairs will soon update the roadmap that will guide Belarus-Iran cooperation.
- On 17 September Lukashenko took part in the Heads of State Council of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization. Key points addressed by Belarusian President included following: accelerate integration of global development strategies; intensify cooperation in healthcare; respond to present-day challenges; create a legal system to combat cyber threats; develop a common transport space; promote renewable energy and nuclear power; use national currencies in international trade more often; help rebuild Afghanistan.

Government program to guide Belarus' innovative development in 2021-2025 adopted

- Belarus President Aleksandr Lukashenko signed decree No.348 on 15 September to approve the government program on innovative development of Belarus in 2021-2025.
- In the course of implementing the new government program organizations of all types of ownership will carry out innovative projects to create new enterprises that match priority directions of scientific, R&D, and innovative activities in 2021-2025. It will allow successfully developing the proprietary scientific and technological potential, promoting Belarusian technologies onto the world market, and using cutting-edge foreign technologies.
- The list of the program's projects meant to create new manufacturing enterprises has to be compiled by the Council of Ministers and will be expanded every year. These projects will be recognized as investment projects. They will receive state support in the form of tax and customs stimuli.
- As a result of the program's implementation by 2025 there are plans to create about 100 highly remunerative export-oriented enterprises, increase the share of innovating organizations in the processing industry up to 30.5%, and increase the volume of export of science-intensive and high-tech products up to \$18.3 billion.

Lukashenko appoints new ambassadors to Tajikistan, Brazil, South Korea

"You understand that we cannot make a mistake in appointing ambassadors," Aleksandr Lukashenko told Minister of Foreign Affairs Vladimir Makei. The foreign minister, in turn, assured that all these people are absolutely reliable and competent.

New Belarusian Constitution. Referendum to be held before February 2022

Extended session of the Constitutional Commission took place on 28 September. Belarusian President Aleksandr Lukashenko headed the discussions.

Lukashenko pointed to the comprehensive nature of the proposed amendments as they cover almost all sections of the Constitution. According to him, the amendments are aimed at bringing the country's fundamental law up to date. Most important proposals of the Constitutional Commission deal with the political system and are aimed at making it more balanced by redistributing powers of the president, parliament and government, introducing the constitutional status of the Belarusian People's Congress and the Central

Election Commission. It was also proposed to expand guarantees of judicial protection of citizens' rights.

Summing up the discussion, Aleksandr Lukashenko announced his Administration will prepare a presidential executive order to create a group in charge of a task to finalize and improve the draft of the Constitution. After the improvement of the current document and its public discussion, lawyers will finalize the document and submit it to the president. Later the document will be put to a referendum.

Proposals to working group are to be submitted within a week in view of the need to finalize the Constitution within a month. Afterwards there should be another meeting to discuss the project and submit it for public consideration.

According to Aleksandr Lukashenko, a referendum on a new version of the Belarusian Constitution will be held no later than February 2022. "It is very important to ensure that all the work on the constitutional construction serves as a basis for consolidation of the Belarusian society and lays a solid legal foundation for the country's development in the future" he said.

In his speech, the Minister of Foreign Affairs gave detailed information on the results of the 9th ministerial conference "Heart of Asia - Istanbul Process", held in Dushanbe on March 30, 2021, and emphasized the important role of Tajikistan in the development of cooperation between the countries of Central Asia and Afghanistan in the economic spheres, trade, energy and security.

On July 13-14, under the chairmanship of the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Tajikistan, a meeting of the Council of Foreign Ministers of the SCO member states was held in Dushanbe.

During the meeting, the heads of the foreign affairs agencies exchanged views on the results of the SCO's activities over 20 years and discussed tasks for the further development of interaction within the organization. It was stated that over two decades the SCO has established itself as an authoritative interstate organization of a new type and an influential participant in the system of international relations.

During the meeting, the Ministers noted that sustainable development in the SCO space is impossible without ensuring an adequate level of security. A Ministerial Council decision was signed to submit to the Dushanbe summit an updated program of cooperation between the SCO member states in the fight against terrorism, separatism and extremism for 2022-2024. The SCO Ministerial Council also paid special attention to the situation in Afghanistan. Profound concern was stated at the prospect of a deterioration of the situation in that country as a result of the withdrawal of the coalition forces.

The head of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Tajikistan stressed that an active process of expanding trade, economic, cultural and humanitarian ties has been going on in Central over the past five years, a characteristic feature of which has become economic dynamism. In this context, S. Mukhriddin confirmed Tajikistan's interest in attracting business circles of South Asian countries to actively invest in the country's economy, especially in the textile and processing industries.

During the meeting, special attention was paid to topical international and regional issues, especially the current situation in Afghanistan. It was noted that today one of the main threats to regional security is the situation in Afghanistan.

It was emphasized that the difficult and dangerous situation in this country in recent days is a problem not only for the Afghan people, but also one of the most acute regional and global problems. The President of Tajikistan noted that the Taliban are reneging on their previous promises to form an interim transitional government with the broad participation of other political forces in the country and are preparing to create an Islamic emirate.

The Tajik side stressed that in order to urgently solve the political security problems of the neighboring country, it is necessary to create an inclusive government with the participation of all national minorities, especially the Tajiks of Afghanistan, who make up more than 46% of the population of this country.

"Tajikistan will never recognize any other government formed in this country through oppression and persecution, without taking into account the position of the entire Afghan people, especially all of its national minorities," said Emomali Rahmon.

The Minister stressed that Tajikistan will support only an inclusive government with the participation of all ethnic groups, in which the Tajiks of Afghanistan will take their rightful place.

The bill stipulates the introduction of appropriate changes and additions to the laws of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On political parties" and "On the status of a deputy of the Legislative Chamber and a member of the Senate of the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan."

In particular, the bill introduces the position of deputy assistant. Also, the requirements, responsibilities, employment and remuneration of the assistant to the deputy are determined.

As noted, this new institution will increase the efficiency of the deputies' work. At the meeting, the bill was adopted by the deputies in the second reading.

President signs a resolution on a new system of state support for orphans and children left without parental care

A Presidential resolution "On measures to introduce a new system of state support for orphans and children left without parental care" was adopted.

According to the Resolution, from 15 August 2021:

- orphans and children left without parental care, without fixed housing, registered as needing housing, in the year they reach the age of 18, are allocated 1-room apartments, in case of marriage between adult orphans 2-room apartments;
- apartments for orphans and children left without parental care are purchased by khokimiyats in the primary real estate market in multi-apartment residential buildings built in cities and districts;
- if there are no apartments on the primary real estate market in the respective districts (cities) that meet the criteria provided for by this Resolution, apartments are purchased on the secondary real estate market;
- the provision of housing for orphans and children left without parental care is carried out on the basis of the "online queue" system;
- housing is allocated to orphans and children left without parental care on the basis of ownership, but without the right to sell, donate, pledge, lease or register at the place of permanent residence in this housing of other citizens, with the exception of himself and his members families (spouse or spouse, children), until they reach the age of 30 years.

Institute of Children's Ombudsman established in Uzbekistan

A Presidential Decree "On measures to further improve the system for ensuring the rights of the child" was adopted.

According to the decree, Institution of the Oliy Majlis Commissioner for the Rights of the Child (Children's Ombudsman) was established.

The position of the Deputy Commissioner for Human Rights of the Oliy Majlis (Ombudsman) - Commissioner for Children's Rights was abolished.

Children's Ombudsman independently exercises its powers and is accountable to the chambers of the Oliy Majlis. Children's Ombudsman elected by the Legislative Chamber and the Senate for a term of five years. A candidate for the position of a children's Ombudsman is submitted by the President for consideration by the chambers of the Oliy Majlis.

From September 1 2021, the following will be created:

- Departments for the protection of children within the Secretariat of the Cabinet of Ministers for Education and Health;
- Secretariat for the protection of children under the Council of Ministers of the Republic of Karakalpakstan, khokimiyats of regions and the city of Tashkent;
- Departments for the protection of children in district (city) khokimiyats.

The Fund will finance self-sustaining projects in priority sectors of the Kyrgyz economy by providing loans, participating in capital and using other financial instruments in relations with business entities registered and operating in Kyrgyzstan.

The Fund is an international organization with a charter capital of \$50 million, which is contributed by Uzbekistan with the subsequent increase of the charter capital to \$200 million.

Issues of avoiding forced labor in the current cotton-picking season discussed

"On 18 August 2021, a regular meeting of the National Commission on Combating Human Trafficking and Forced Labor was held.

The meeting focused on the issues of providing assistance to victims of trafficking in persons, their rehabilitation, as well as protecting the interests of our citizens abroad. It was emphasized that comprehensive assistance is being provided to women victims of trafficking in persons, who returned after a long stay abroad and deported women.

The event also discussed the implementation of the recommendations of the annual report of the US Department of State in practice, an agreement was reached on the development of an appropriate "Roadmap" in this direction.

At the meeting, attention was also paid to issues awaiting their decision on combating human trafficking and forced labor. It was criticized that there are still cases of forced employment by the heads of individual local executive bodies, lower-level structures of ministries and departments.

During the meeting, participants also discussed issues of preventing forced labor in the current cotton picking season, the correct formalization of labor relations, and the creation of decent working and rest conditions for pickers.

An appropriate decision of the National Commission was made on the issues discussed under the agenda, and the tasks ahead were identified.

President holds a dialogue with entrepreneurs

During a short-term stay on the territory of Uzbekistan, evacuees are provided with all the necessary assistance in compliance with strict quarantine measures, after which they are all sent to the countries of destination without delay.

During his speech at the seventy-fifth session of the General Assembly, in September 2020, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev proposed to develop under the United Nations auspices an International Code on Voluntary Commitments of States during Pandemics.

According to the Permanent Mission of Uzbekistan to the UN, our country has prepared the text of the International Code on Voluntary Commitments of States during Pandemics, which is published as an official document of the 75th session of the UN General Assembly. It has been translated into the six official languages of the United Nations - Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish, and is widely distributed among all Member States and specialized agencies and agencies of the United Nations.

The Code, published by the UN, emphasizes the importance of cooperation in global responses to pandemics should be based on the principles of unity, solidarity, openness, mutual assistance and the protection of human rights.

The publication of the text of the Code as an official document of the 75th session of the UN General Assembly is undoubtedly an important contribution of Uzbekistan to the international efforts in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic and in elaborating a global compact.

Tree protection to strengthen, Environmental Police to be organized

"On August 24, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev chaired a videoconference on improving the environmental situation, effectively organizing tree protection and expanding green space.

Important tasks to improve the environmental situation and expand green space were identified. The task has been set to plant 55 million seedlings in the fall of this year along highways, along the perimeter of fields and in all settlements, and in the spring of next year – 70 million seedlings of mulberry, paulownia, maple, oak, walnut, narrow-leaved oak, poplar and other fruit and ornamental trees.

The main attention was paid to the creation of green areas and public parks in cities.

Therefore, the responsible persons have been instructed to carry out a complete inventory of trees in all recreation parks and to increase the number of public parks. It was noted that 70 percent of recreation parks should be green areas, in which it is prohibited to build any buildings and structures.

The Head of the state ordered to strengthen measures to protect trees. In particular, the Tree Felling Moratorium will be extended until 2024, and the responsibility for violating it will

be significantly increased. It is strictly forbidden to cut trees in green areas and public parks.

An Environmental Police will be established in Tashkent and regional centers. It will be entrusted with the tasks of combating offenses in the ecology, including unauthorized felling of trees, disposal of waste in the wrong place, poaching and others.

Solar photovoltaic plant commissioned in Uzbekistan

On the eve of the 30th anniversary of Uzbekistan's independence, the country's first solar photovoltaic plant has been commissioned in Karmana district of Navoi region.

The construction of the complex began last year. Investments for \$110 million were allocated and 300 thousand solar panels were installed. The plant's capacity is 100 megawatts.

The project, called "Nur Navoi Solar", is implemented by Masdar company of the United Arab Emirates. The President emphasized the cooperation with this country that is developing every year. In the energy sector alone, six projects with a capacity of 1.7 thousand megawatts worth about \$1.5 billion are being implemented jointly with the UAE. The importance of this plant is that it will provide sustainable energy for the growing needs of the population and industry at an affordable price of 2.67 US cents per kilowatt-hour. Another important aspect is that new directions of line production and modern technologies appear thanks to such projects in Uzbekistan.

- to prepare and adopt a Comprehensive Program for the implementation of the Treaty on longterm good-neighborliness, friendship and cooperation of the SCO member states for 2023-2027 to further build up the multifaceted partnership between the SCO member states;
- to develop a Joint Action Plan for the Development of Intraregional Trade, which provides for measures to eliminate trade barriers, approximate technical regulations, digitalize customs procedures, as well as implement other measures to facilitate mutual access to markets;
- to adopt the SCO Strategy for the Development of Transport Connectivity which will make it possible to fully use the transit potential of our countries and increase the efficiency of the East-West and North-South corridors system;
- to launch a mechanism of regular ministerial meetings and expert consultations in food security issues;
- to establish an expert SCO Forum in information security to adequately respond to modern threats and challenges in cyberspace;

- to develop an intergovernmental agreement on cooperation between SCO member countries in tourism.

Following the meeting, the Dushanbe Declaration on the Twentieth Anniversary of the SCO was adopted. 30 documents were signed aimed at further enhancing multifaceted cooperation within the organization.
