
PAST SIMPLE

We use past simple to talk about events in the past.



Regular verbs

To talk about the past using regular verbs, we add -ed to the verb. For example,

$$start \rightarrow started$$

If a verb ends with **-e**, we only add **-d**. For example,





I liked the film. \rightarrow I **did not like** the film.
