Other verbs

We form present simple with the base form of the verb.

For example,

I watch TV.



They watch TV.



With *he*, *she*, and *it*, we add *-s* to the verb.

For example,

I play football.



She plays football.



If a verb ends with *-o*, *-tch*, or *-sh*, we add *-es* when we use it with *he*, *she*, and *it*.

For example,

I go to the gym.



She goes to the gym.

Negatives

To form negatives with *to be*, we use **not** after the verb.

For example,

I am happy.



I am not happy.



To form negatives with other verbs, we use **do/does not** before the verb.

For example,

Tony has a dog.



Tony does not have a dog.

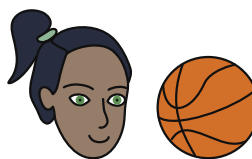

To ask questions with *to be*, we use ***to be*** at the start of the sentence.

For example,

I am happy. → **Am** I happy?



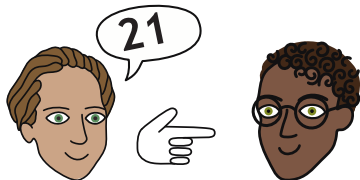
To ask questions with other verbs, we use ***do/does*** at the start of the sentence.

For example,

Tony has a dog. → **Does** Tony have a dog?
